Darlington & District Motor Club will organise a meeting on 5th & 6th September 2020 using the Croft circuit, this meeting will be held under the National Sporting Code and Standing Regulations of the ACU together with these Supplementary Regulations and any Final Instructions, which may be issued.

Covid 19

The Darlington & District Motor Club are operating this Race Weekend in accordance with Government guidelines, advice, and instruction in order to minimise the underlying and unavoidable risk to Competitors from Covid-19. Due to the current pandemic which we all find ourselves in, competitors and officials should be aware that this event is, as with any other sporting event, subject to UK Government advice / guidance. As the governing body for motorcycle sport in Great Britain (less Northern Ireland), the ACU are bound to follow and adhere to current and up to date Government regulations. As such, the Permit for this event may be withdrawn subject to government advice/guidance issued leading up to the event. Alternatively, again dependent on UK Government regulations in force leading up to the event, it may be necessary to reduce the duration of the event. Should this be the case all competitors / officials will be notified as soon as possible.

- 2. Eligibility/Licences:- Open to holders of a 2020 Competition licence for Road Racing issued by the ACU/SACU or FIM Europe Affiliated Federations. Riders with licences issued by Federations other than the ACU or SACU must have starting permission from the Federations with personal insurance and repatriation insurance to cover the minimum FIM benefit. Proof of which must be presented to the organisers prior to taking part in the competition.
- 3. Entry Fees: Displayed prices are inclusive of the ACU insurance and are for the two days.
- 4. Entries: All entries must be made on Official Entry Form and send to the Motor Sport Secretary no later than the official closing date. Payment by BACS preferred bank details on the entry forms, cheques to be made payable to DDMC LTD. The club reserves the right to refuse any entry and to abandon, cancel or postpone the meeting. The organisers undertake to insure each driver and passenger, indemnifying them against any third part claims made arising out of the races or official practice. excluding claims by other drivers or passengers, entrant, sponsor or mechanic. All driver and passenger will be covered by personal accident insurance whilst practising and racing.
- 5. Cancellations: Competitors may cancel their entry for the meeting provided this is made in writing by the competitor and sent by post together with all passes and paperwork to be received by the Motor Sports Secretary no later than 48 Hours prior to the meeting. Cancellations made in accordance with these conditions will qualify for a refund with the deduction of a £20 Administration fee.

IN CIRCUMSTANCES, LEADING TO A CANCELLATION OR ABANDONMENT OR POSTPONEMENT OF A MEETING ENTRY FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.

- 6. Course: Croft Circuit Permanent Course Licence No: 075. Croft Circuit is 2.1 miles long and situated between Darlington and Northallerton on the A167 one mile south of the village of Croft on Tees Post code DL2 2PL
- 7. Awards: 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each race will receive a trophy. The Awards can be collected from the Race Office after 5pm on race days. Please ensure you comply with current Government guidelines in respect of social distancing. All awards will be handed over in individual sealed polythene bags. You must collect your own trophies.

- 8. Practise: 09:30 Saturday each competitor will have one 10 minute session. The practice schedule will be published in the official programme and final instructions. A competitor must complete 3 laps of practise to qualify.
- 9. Programme: Entries will be accepted for machines, Sidecars open unlimited, Solo's, Scooter's

Event: - Event 1 -600cc, 1000cc open/ Event 2 - All other solo machines excluding Classis & formula Junior (see eligibility sheet)/ Event 3 open Side Cars, Event 4 Scooters

If insufficient entries are received for any classes, the club reserves the right to cancel the class or incorporate it with another and alter awards at its discretion. Note When an EVENT is oversubscribed the fastest 40 riders from timed practice will go forward to the EVENT. The remainder will go into NON-QUALIFIERS EVENT which will be combined with another class.

- 10. Timing: Race timing will be by Transponder system. Competitors not in possession of their own transponder may hire a transponder from the organisers, indication on the entry form if applicable. Where a competitor is riding in two different classes, they must use a different transponder for each class.
- 11. Grid Positions: The practise session for each class on Saturday will be timed. It is most important that riders go out in the correct practise session for their class. Grid positions will be posted in the race office before racing commences and will be allocated from the timed practice. There will be no timed practice on Sunday. Sunday only driver will start from the back of the grid. In the event of a failure of timing equipment, the club will allocate grid positions.
- 12 Start Procedure: Once the warm up lap is completed and the grid formed, no delay to the start will be permitted. Stalled or defective machines will be removed from the Grid. All events will be Clutch start. A Red Signal Light will be displayed for up to (5) Five seconds, the red light will go out to start the race or the National Flag will be lowered. Any rider who is adjudged to have made a "False Start" (THIS INCLUDES NOT RETURNING TO OR STARTING FROM A POSITION OTHER THAN THAT ALLOTTED ON THE GRID) will incur a time penalty.
- 13. Finish of the Race: The chequered flag will be shown as the winner finished and each driver crossing the line after the winner will be flagged off. To be classed as a finisher, a Rider must cross the line within two minutes of the winner and have completed at least 75% of the race distance.
- 14. Signing On ALL COMPETITORS MUST SIGN ON PRIOR TO TECHNICAL VERIFICATION. In light of Covid-19, the Signing On process will now be as follows: Signing on will taking into consideration social distancing measures. Each competitor will need to show their ACU competition licence and will be verbally asked by the Race Office Staff if they agree to the standard declaration which will be provided for them to read. If the competitor agrees to the declaration, his name will be ticked accordingly on the Signing On Sheet. Competitors should hold the licence sufficiently for the Race Office staff to be able to view the photograph and turn the licence on the flip side so the Race Office staff can view the reverse of the licence.

Any driver or passenger unable to produce their Licence will only be allowed to compete at the discretion of the Stewards of the meeting. A Technical Verification card will be issued to you, this must be taken to Technical Verification.

15. Machine Technical Verification: -

You will be asked by a Technical Official to place your Motorcycle /clothing/helmets etc in pre-designated areas. The competitor will then step away to a safe distance to allow the Technical Official to carry out the inspection. Prior to the motorcycle / clothing / helmet / gloves / boots being taken to Technical Inspection, competitors should wipe these items with a disinfectant wipe/cloth before going to Technical Inspection. Signing of the necessary declarations will be as per the process for Signing On.

Technical Verification for all classes will be as follows: - Friday 16.00 to 18.00 (Official staff permitting) Saturday 7.30am, Sunday 10am

- 16. Riders Briefing: All rider will attend a Clerk of the Course Briefing on Saturday Morning a 08.45, this will be held in the pit lane opposite race control. Riders: Under 18 together with parents will attend a separate briefing with the Clerk of the Course in the pit lane opposite race control at 09.00
- 17. Re Examination of Machines: Crashed machines will be returned to the Technical Verification bay by the recover vehicles. It is the responsibility of the rider to present his machine for re-examination subsequent to accident damage together with his helmet and clothing. Any rider falling from their machine in practice or a race MUST present themselves to the medical centre for confirmation by the Circuit Doctor that they are fit to continue racing.
- 18. Noise :- All machines must conform to ACU Noise requirements 105dB/A No racing engines to be run before 9am Saturday and 12 noon on Sunday.
- 19. Race Numbers: Race number plate and numbers displayed on machines taking part in the meeting must comply with ACU regulations.
- 20. Identification. Frame and Engine Numbers: Machines presented for Technical Verification with tampered or deleted Engine and Frame Numbers in the cases of solo machines and Engine Numbers only on sidecar machines will be discqualified from the meeting.
- 21. Change of Machine/Rider: Either the Rider/Passenger or machine but not both may be changed on a request in writing to the Secretary of the Meeting no later than 9.00am on the day of the meeting. Only an Entrant holding a current Entrants licence may request a change of rider.
- 22. Maximum Number of Starters: Solo's 40 (Practice 60) Sidecars 30 (Practice 45)
- 23. Competitors Passes: Solo- 1 vehicle and 3 personal passes per competitor. Sidecars 2 vehicle passes and 6 personal passes per team. Entrants with ACU and SACU Entrants Licences (which must be quoted on the entry form) will receive 1 vehicle pass and 2 personal passes (this will be sent to the rider and it is their responsibility to forward them to the Entrant).
- 24. A limited number of garages maybe available depending on restrictions of Covid, cost to be advised on enquiry
- 25. The riding or use of Motorised Paddock Bikes, Bicycles, Skates, Slate Boards, Rollerblades and the like is strictly forbidden.
- 26. All competitors parked upon the paddock-grassed area MUST use an Environmental Mat at all times

ANY PERSON CONTRAVENING ITEMS 24,25 OR 26 ABOVE, RISK FACING A FINE OR DISQUALIFICATION FROM THE MEETING

Additional Information

Fallen Riders

If a competitor falls / loses contact with his machine during the course of practice / racing, if able to do so, he is to give the Marshals 'the thumbs up' to indicate he is unhurt. If, however, the competitor is unable to do this, the Marshals will react in the normal manner and tend to the competitor wearing appropriate PPE (face masks / gloves). Medical support will be deployed as per the request of Marshals to Race Control. Competitors and Officials should bear in mind that due to Covid-19 restrictions, this may cause additional delays which may cause a delay to the race programme.

ACU Signatures/Race Results

There will be no signing of licenses. Results can downloaded from Spots Timing on your return home.

Paddock Facilities & Etiquette

Dependent on UK Government Advice/Guidance in place prior to the start of this event, the facilities to purchase food/refreshments in the paddock, may not be open. You will be notified whether the facilities are open or not nearer to the event and as such competitors and officials should be prepared to bring their own refreshments etc for the duration of the event. If, however the facilities are open, then appropriate social distancing measures will be put in place. The toilet facilities in the paddock will be open, but all competitors and officials should note there will be a process in place to restrict the amount of people in the toilets at one time to adhere to social distancing measures.

Entry to the Circuit

On entering the circuit, competitors and officials should follow the instructions given to them on arrival and ensure they follow and adhere to the signage on display regarding control measures put in place to minimise the risks of infection and at all times adhere to the up to date UK Government advice / guidance relating to Social Distancing.

Parking in the Paddock

Vehicles will be parked appropriately to allow for Social Distancing measures.

Covid 19 Awareness

If you have symptoms of Covid 19 (a new continuous cough, sore throat, a temperature above 37.5c or a sudden loss of taste and or smell then you must not travel to the circuit, or:

If you or anyone in your party develops symptoms of Covid 19 whilst at the venue you/they must leave the circuit immediately, return home and follow Government guideline on what to do next.

You must also notify the Organisers by telephone on 07950248105 as soon as possible to advise you have returned home.
